New U.B.C. Services from Sea-Bus, Richmond

Two new U.B.C. special buses are scheduled to begin service Sept. 10, the first day of most classes at the university. They'll be especially useful for passengers from North Vancouver and Richmond.

One is a new route — the 85 Sea-Bus/U.B.C. with two departures from Granville Waterfront Station: 7:50 and 8:50 a.m. The departures are timed to connect with Sea-Bus and get passengers to classes beginning at 8:30 and 9:30 a.m.

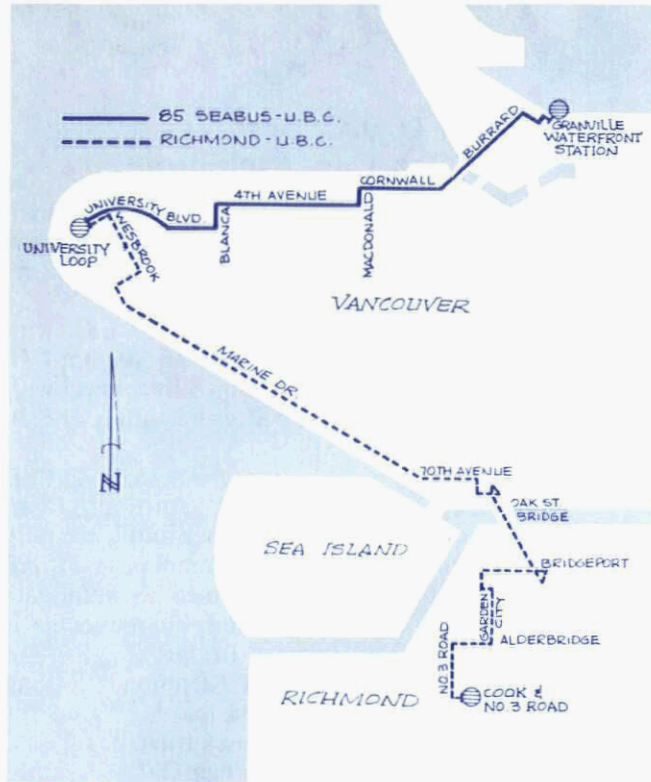
The Sea-Bus/U.B.C. travels from the Station via Cordova, Granville, Hastings, Burrard, Cornwall, Point Grey Road, Macdonald, Fourth, Blanca and University Boulevard to University Loop (see map page 2). **All regular stops** will be made downtown to accommodate transfers from other connecting routes, but the service is non-stop to U.B.C. from Burrard Bridge.

The other new service is from Richmond, leaving Cook and No. Three Road at 7:35 and 8:35 a.m. for 8:30 and 9:30 a.m. classes. The buses travel via Cook, No. Three Road, Alderbridge, Garden City, Sexsmith, (connecting with the Park-and-Ride), Bridgeport, St. Edwards, Oak Street Bridge, Marine Drive, Hudson, 70th, Marine, 16th, Westbrook and University Boulevard to University Loop (see map page 2).

All regular stops will be made in Richmond, but the service will be non-stop to U.B.C. from the Oak Street Bridge.

STUDENTS BACK, NEW PASSES ISSUED

The return of school this week of elementary and secondary students is a big event for them, but has a special meaning for everyone else, too.

Motorists, naturally, should be aware that students will be walking and riding their bikes to classes during school hours and should watch for them on the roads.

Transit passengers should be prepared for slightly more crowded buses at times when students are heading to and from classes.

And students themselves should be receiving their new bus passes for the current school year, issued individually by the schools in which they are enrolled. However, last year's passes are valid until Sept. 15.

The passes entitle students to travel for a reduced single zone fare of 25 cents (half the adult fare) and are good at all times throughout the system. It is not necessary to show your pass upon boarding the bus during school hours, but you must have it ready for the driver to see upon request. Passes must be shown during non-school hours.

We welcome all students back to classes, and we hope, regular use of the transit system.

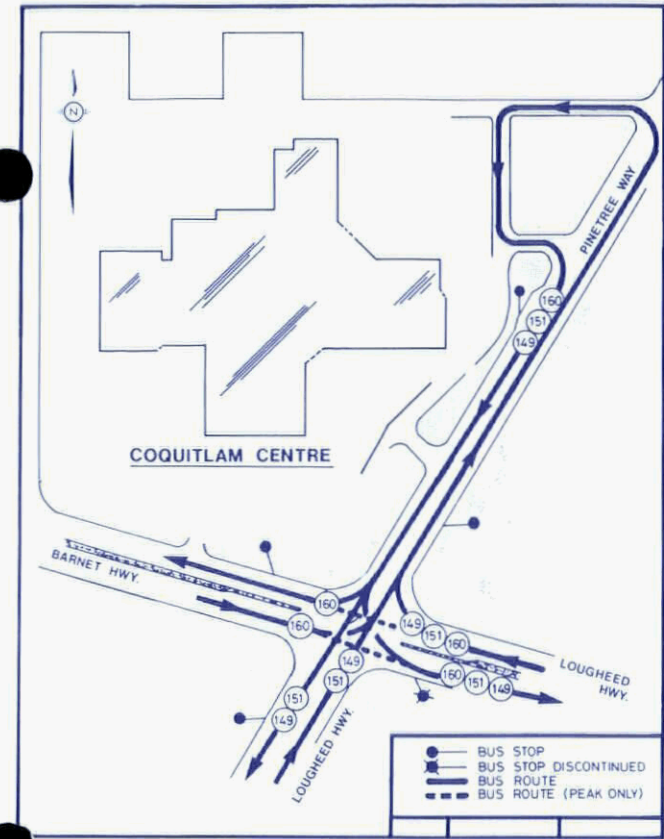
HONESTY CLEARS CONSCIENCE
