TIMETABLE ADJUSTMENTS

640 VALLEY TO SEA

Under the heading "Vancouver Island", the one-way fares between Swartz Bay and downtown Victoria should be revised as follows: Adult, \$1.40; student, 70¢; senior citizens and children 5-11, 60¢.

49 FORTY NINTH

Since running times on morning westbound trips have had to be adjusted, all westbound trips between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m., weekdays, generally leave 2 minutes earlier than indicated in the timetables.

601 SOUTH DELTA

The 7:49 a.m. northbound bus now follows its usual downtown routing: Dunsmuir, Hornby to Pender.

608 LADNER RING

Because of changes in running times, buses now leave Hornby at Dunsmuir at 4:06 p.m., 4:26, 4:56 and 5:26.

Trips leaving the Ladner Exchange via the #1 Ring Route are 3 to 5 minutes earlier than the times shown in the timetable, with one exception — the last trip leaves the Exchange at 6:20 p.m. in order to make connections.

SURREY — NORTH DELTA

On page 3 of the timetable please note that the 312 trips leaving Melville at Thurlow should all be indicated as P.M. trips.

ROUTE AND TERMINUS REVISION

413 WESTMINSTER HIGHWAY

From Westminster Highway and Gilley, buses now follow the regular route to No. 3 Road and Granville then travel via Granville, Buswell, Park to the new terminus on Park.

On the return trip from Park and Buswell, buses travel via Park, No. 3 Road and the regular route to Westminster Highway and Gilley.

SPECIAL DAILY SERVICE TO B.C. RAILWAY STATION

A bus marked SPECIAL with "B.C. Rail" in the auxiliary sign holder, now leaves Vancouver Bus Depot every day at 6:40 a.m. and picks up passengers at all North Vancouver bus stops along Georgia to Chilco. From Chilco it operates non-stop to the B.C. Railway Station, arriving at approximately 7:00 a.m.

Every evening, a bus leaves the B.C. Railway Station at 8:40 p.m. and travels non-stop to Georgia and Chilco. From Chilco it follows Georgia to the Vancouver Bus Depot, dropping passengers off along the way and arriving at approximately 9:00 p.m.

The fare for all passengers on this special service is \$1. Transit passes are not accepted. Transfers are not issued or accepted.

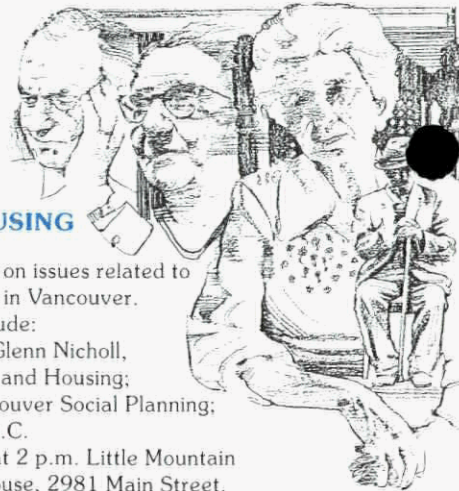
